- D10 EB Board met in May, one topic of discussion was the Bantam B2 league. Based on gathered stats over the past 2 seasons, the Bantam B2 games will move back to 1 hour playing time. This will be discussed more at the Presidents meeting this summer

D10 Director - Colleen Donovan -

- Mites D10 EB board determined that each D10 association has to have an A mite team. This 20-21 season, Mites can play 6 full ice games, next season it will drop to 4, the season after will drop to 2 full ice games and in 2024, there will be no full ice games allowed.
 - 1. D10 is willing to offer for the coming season, if your Mite teams play <u>NO Full Ice</u> games, D10 will give the association a \$500 incentive, since it will get to 0 games in a few years. Trying to build a teaching tool.
 - 2. D10 is the only district that hosts ³/₄ ice games. Please send Dave England the contact information for your youth refs.
- State Tournaments those that were supposed to host, will be allowed to host this season, since they were not able to host last season
- Combined Leagues D10 has had it in the past (Peewee from other districts playing and schedule games ect...) It will be determined between the directors where the team will play their district tournament games.
- Play Down Bantam Age level player, to play down at the lower level (peewee in this example) they will no be allowed to play in region or state tournaments
- If any player from Squirt up, gets a fighting penalty, they will be out for 3 games (suspension) If they get a 2nd fighting penalty, that player will be ejected from paying for the rest of the season. Any game played under MN hockey (District and tournament games count)
- MN Hockey meetings again this coming weekend June 26 June 28th) (hoping for more discussion on the fighting penalty)
- Does an association have to accept anyone as a member MNH has contacted USAH about this and MNH has put a committee together to address. More details to come from MNH
- DIRECTOR AWARDS

- In reference to associations having to declare a Mite A team. Years ago, we promoted C and D levels. If for some reason you feel your association can not declare a Mite A team, get all your information together and you will be required to present your argument to the D10 Competition committee.
- If it is determined that an association can NOT declare an A team at the mite level, than they will be required to present what they plan to do to ensure they have an A team the next season.

• If an association does not feel they can host a Mite A team, they need to get that information to the competition committee by October 1st, so that the competition committee can meet with the association and get moving on plans.

- Early Roster signoff requests, prior to roster sign off there will not be a fee of \$100 applied.

Presidents Reports

Andover :

- Held electronic annual meeting and elections get more participation and more votes
- Handle the virus going to follow the rink plans
- Gambling has taken a turn for the worse, increase in fees may be as high as 20% Anoka:
 - Annual board meeting will be in July
 - Board meeting is next week to determine in annual meeting will be held electronic or in person
 - Policies have been written, they have a COvid Waiver that will need to be signed by each player and member
 - Worry about retention of players

Becker/Big Lake :

- Annual elections were held, (election runner) had the highest turn out for elections
- Looking to use 3 phase approach whate3ver guidelines the Princeton arena has, BBL will follow those guidelines as well

Blaine :

- 3 new board members
- Election was held electronically, over 325 votes, compared to in person meeting of only 60 or so persons
- Covid following state, local and rink guidelines
- Gambling will be coming in about 40% lower that normal about \$800 shortage per player

Cambridge-Isanti:

- Held annual meeting in March, but had lower turn out
- gambling is lower, and will have to look at increase in fees
- Will be following state and local guidelines and rink

Centennial : not in attendance

Champlin Park :

- Also had annual meeting, electronically and it was successful
- Held board meeting in June, in person, with social distancing had electronic as well for those that wanted to stream in
- gambling is low, maybe 50% down
- They will be using rainy day fund and hopefully not raise any fees this coming season
- Working on policies, following city and rink guidelines before they determine if more guidelines are needed.

Coon Rapids:

- Have not had annual meeting yet next meeting is in a couple weeks looking into online ideas for voting
- Gambling has been affected as well
- Following state, local and arena guidelines currently

Elk River:

- Held meeting electronically through survey monkey, and had success
- Mite games question does it include jamborees for full ice? Yes, it does
- Rinks are still under construction, so they do not have plans for covid
- Concern about numbers being down what about declarations? Can they be moved to later?
- Question Fine schedule, is out of control. The number of things that associations are fined is out of control. If Presidents are fined for not showing up, then D10 members should be fined when they do not attend.

- Attendance at D10 meetings does not need to be the President it can be any member of an association board or create a position on your board
- Discipline issues need to be handled fairly across all the associations.

- Hoping to not have to raise fees

Rogers :

- Held annual meeting in February
- Board is looking to change policy to do electronically since other associations have had success
- Gambling has taken a hit, gambling manager got PPP loan, which they hope will help. The loan will help the association to keep their fees the same for the coming season
- Covid following state and local guidelines, for tryouts, will be purchasing reversable jerseys that players will keep with them for the whole tryout process

Spring Lake Park : not in attendance

St. Francis :

- Annual election was in May, lower turn out
- Covid working with the committee and local guidelines '
- Sent out survey about retention for the coming season and fees -looking to get feedback from the parents more to come
